

Learning Project WEEK 7 (wc 18.05.20) - Celebrations

Age Range: YEAR 5

Weekly Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

Weekly focus: Adding decimals with the same number of decimal places, subtracting decimals with the same number of decimal places, adding decimals with a different number of decimal places, subtracting decimals with a different number of decimal places.

- Search 'White Rose Home Learning Year 5'. Moving on Summer Term – Week 2.

There are 5 lessons which consist of a teaching video and an activity sheet. The answers are also attached. (If you have no printer at home, just write the answers on some paper and keep hold of them or snap a photo and upload it on Class dojo or Purple Mash for your teacher to see.)

Further activities to support this learning are:

- Go on ixl (link found on the school website under pupils – home learning) to access the following activities on the Year 5 Maths section, Add and Subtract Decimals – W.8 – W.10
- Make up your own calculations using decimals? Both adding and subtracting.
- Write a number story using decimals that are either added or subtracted.
For example – *I went to the shops and bought a bag of potatoes for £1.99 and a bag of carrots that cost £1.69. Altogether I spent £3.68.*

Weekly focus (arithmetic)

Divide numbers by 10, 100 and 1000.

- Search by typing dividing by 10, 100 and 1000, select the first option and explore the games that are available.
- Complete with an adult in the house – who can answer questions the quickest?

Weekly Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

Weekly Focus: To recommend books they have read giving reasons for their choices.

Log onto **Purple Mash** and navigate to – Serial Mash, Sapphires and find the book Film Seen

- Read Chapter 1 and complete online multiple-choice task and the sequencing activity.
- Read Chapter 2 and complete online multiple-choice task & Open Ended Questions.
- Read Chapter 3 and complete the online multiple-choice task and the sequencing activity.
- Read Chapters 4 and 5 and complete the online multiple-choice task for both chapters.
- Read Chapter 6 and complete the online multiple-choice task and the Book Review.

Additional tasks/reading fluency practice:

- Listen to your child read and let them discuss what they have read. Encourage them to read with expression and intonation.
- Watch [Newsround](#) and discuss what is happening in the wider world.
- Complete a comprehension on Read Theory site.

Remember to complete any quizzes for books you read on Accelerated Reader (link on website)

Weekly Writing Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

Weekly Focus: To provide information, using specific detailed and emotive language to inform the reader.

- To write an information text about how birthdays are celebrated differently around the world. Remember to use technical/correct vocabulary and write in paragraphs with different sub-headings.
- To write in role – write a diary entry in the role of a person from a different country who celebrates their birthday in a different way. What is their day like? What emotions do they feel? Remember to write it in first person.

Weekly focus (spelling and grammar)

1. Spellings – Statutory words

- Practise spelling these words daily:
occur, forty, according, lightning, stomach, pronunciation, signature, criticise, immediately, attached,
- Spelling quiz at the end of the week set on Purple Mash/create your own at home.

2. Grammar – irregular past tense.

- Go on ixl (link found on the school website under pupils – home learning) to access the following activities on the Year 5 English section,

Learning Project - to be done throughout the week

This project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to learn more about celebrations. Learning may focus on different types of celebrations that take place and who may celebrate them. It could look at how people celebrate different events differently in other parts of the world.

Planning a Celebration- it's time to plan a celebration event of their choice. This could be a birthday party, an Eid celebration, an Easter hunt or anything else they wish to plan. Tell them they have £150 to spend and 25 guests will be attending. What will the money be spent on? Ask them to plan the celebration considering the location of the event, how they will decorate the venue, what their guests will eat and drink and how they will entertain their guests. Get them to detail the timings of the event and any timings for preparation.

Time to Design- Can they imagine their perfect celebration outfit? What would it look like? What would it be made from? How comfortable would it need to be? Ask them to design a costume for a celebration of their choice. Think about the patterns they would like to incorporate on their design and the cultural traditions.

Birthdays around the World- Birthdays are celebrated differently in different countries. Write an information report detailing how birthdays are celebrated in the following countries: China, England, Spain, Italy and Mexico. Ask your child which country would they like to celebrate their birthday based on their findings? Why?

What's the same and what is different? - Select a holiday/festival of their choice and research how different countries around the world celebrate this event. They could compare whether it is celebrated at the same time, the outfits people wear, the food eaten etc. Make a video, poster or report of the things they have discovered.

British Celebrations- In Great Britain, Valentine's Day, St Patrick's Day and Bonfire Night are just some of the celebrations that take place. Ask your child to choose one celebration day and research how the celebration came to be. Using the information they have found, plot the events on a timeline and include dates, details and pictures/sketches. Now create a poster advertising the celebration day. This could be done on a computer programme of your choice or on paper.
