Weekly Maths Tasks

Weekly focus: Fractions, Percentages and Decimals.

If a printer is unavailable then your child can write the questions and their answers down on a piece of paper and take a photo to upload to their teacher on either Purple Mash or Class Dojo.

More paper based activities can be found below:

- Create a poster showing the conversions of simple fractions ($\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{1}{4}$ etc) to decimals and percentages
- Create a mini quiz that somebody can complete that tests their ability to convert from Fractions to Decimals to Percentages!

Weekly focus (arithmetic): Finding 10%, 25%, 50% and 75%

- Ask an adult to give you a list of 10 numbers. As quickly as you can find out all of the above %'s of that number.
- Create a step by step poster explaining how to find these and what to do if the number has to go into decimal places.

Weekly Reading Tasks

Weekly focus: to understand the structure of a text

Read 'The Time Lock Adventures' and related tasks set on [Purple Mash](#)

Aim to complete one chapter each day.

Additional tasks/reading fluency practice:

- Listen to your child read and let them discuss what they have read. Encourage them to read with expression and intonation.
- Watch [Newsround](#) and discuss what is happening in the wider world.
- Complete a comprehension on [Read Theory](#) site.

Weekly Writing Tasks

Weekly focus: To use a range of clauses to convey a celebratory atmosphere

- Watch 'Day of the Dead' on Literacy Shed. Use this to write a newspaper article about the festival. Use relative and subordinating clauses to add detail to your writing.
- Plan a celebration for when Lockdown is over. What will be some of the first things you will do? Who will you invite? How long will it last?

Learning Project - to be done throughout the week

This project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to learn more about celebrations. Learning may focus on different types of celebrations that take place and who may celebrate them. It could look at how people celebrate different events differently in other parts of the world.

Let's Wonder:

Birthdays are celebrated differently in different countries. Write an information report detailing how birthdays are celebrated in the following countries: China, England, Spain, Italy and Mexico. Ask your child which country would they like to celebrate their birthday based on their findings? Why?

Let's Create:

Time to Design- Can they imagine their perfect celebration outfit? What would it look like? What would it be made from? How comfortable would it need to be? Ask them to design a costume for a celebration of their choice. Think about the patterns they would like to incorporate on their design and the cultural traditions.

Be Active:

In line with celebrations, and Christmas being a very popular one, try this 12 days of Christmas workout!



Time to Talk:

Celebrations over time: Talk to your child about how something you celebrate as a family has changed over time. They could call upon other friends and family to find out which traditions have stayed the same, and which aspects have changed. Why do they think these changes have occurred? How would they feel if the next time they celebrated, they did it in the same way as their grandparents!

Understanding Others and Appreciating Differences:

Independence day – Research and discuss different countries 'independence day' celebrations and research the history surrounding them.
