The campaign's slogan, "Together for a better internet", encourages everyone to join together and play their part in creating a better internet for everyone, and especially for younger users.

Safer Internet Day is organised by the joint Insafe/INHOPE network, each February to promote the safe and positive use of digital technology, especially among children and young people. Celebrated usually on the second day of the second week of the second month, each year on Safer Internet Day millions of people unite to inspire positive changes online, to raise awareness of online safety issues, and participate in events and activities right across the globe.

Safer Internet Day aims to create both a safer and a better internet, where everyone is empowered to use technology responsibly, respectfully, critically and creatively. The campaign aims to reach out to children and young people, parents and carers, teachers, educators and social workers, as well as industry, decision makers and politicians, to encourage everyone to play their part in creating a better internet. We are all looking forward to finding out more very soon!

Unauthorised absence resulting from long term poor attendance:

- If your child is absent from school due to being ill - please contact us on the first day of absence to let us know. We may ask for evidence.
- If your child's attendance falls below 90% you will be sent a letter asking you to make sure it improves immediately.
- **If you arrive in school after 9.20am your child will receive a 'U' mark on the register. This will count as an unauthorised absence.**
- If it remains below 90% you will be called to meet with us to agree a plan to improve your child's attendance.
- If you do not come to this meeting or your child's attendance still does not improve after this meeting our DSL Mrs Michelle Stephens will refer you to the Education Welfare Officer, and they may decide to begin a legal process including a penalty notice charge and/or taking you to court.

Finally, we are here to help. If you are experiencing difficulties with your child's attendance, particularly if they are having health problems, please talk to us. We will be able to discuss the issue and find ways to support you.

Thank you again to the vast majority of you who support your children by making sure they come to school every day.
