Jaiden O, 5S has enjoyed reading his book this week and also playing board games.




Michael S, 6B has been practicing his Maths and Spelling this week.

Dylan T, 30'L has been learning the time this week.




Joel G, 30'L has spent time doing some Maths work this week.



Chloe & Lucie P, 4E have been learning how to make bread at home this week.




Rory H, 4E has had a VE history session and has completed writing about it, as well as making a medal.
