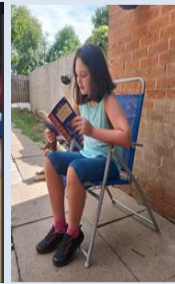
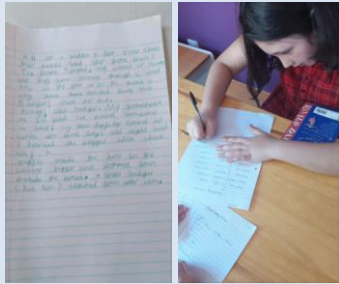

Lola K, 3D has been helping out in the garden.



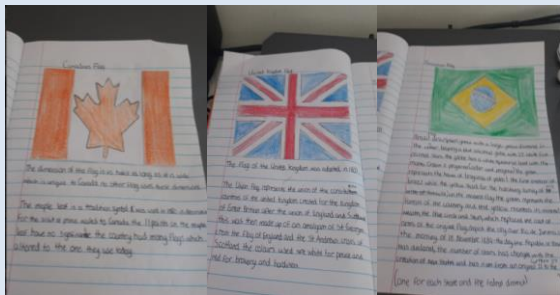
Oliver S, 4E has been playing football.



Laylah B, 4E has been busy creating an African Mask.



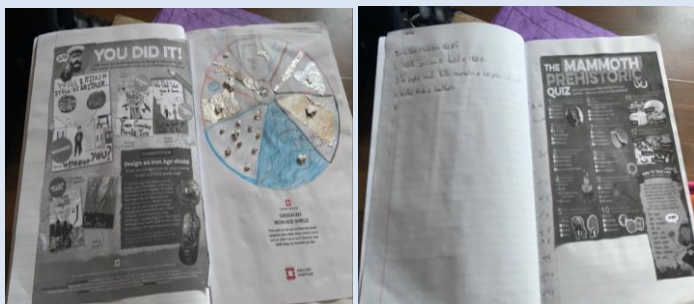
Rory H, 4E has designed his own postcard this week.



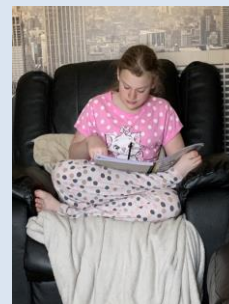
Harrison B, 5W has been researching flags. He has drawn some and wrote about them.

COVID-19 Return to School information

<p>The school will do its best to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Provide an environment which has been risk assessed in response to the COVID-19 infection; Adhere to the social distancing rules as set out by the government as much as we reasonably can; Provide a curriculum that meets the needs of your child's well-being, mental health and academic needs; Contact parents/carers if your child displays symptoms of COVID-19; Inform you if staff or children in your child's 'bubble' show symptoms of COVID-19 as this will mean you will all need to self-isolate for at least 14 days or until the test comes back negative; Continue our clear and consistent approach to recognise/celebrate and address behavioural choices as set out in the Behaviour Policy as well as the expectations outlined in this agreement; Communicate between home and school through, Class Dojo, text, Parentmail and the school website. 	<p>To help my child at school, I know and understand that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> If my child, or anyone in my household, shows symptoms of COVID-19, I will not send them to school, we will self-isolate for 14 days as a family. I will get them tested and I will let the school know as soon as possible via telephone; If my child, or another child in the group, shows symptoms of COVID-19 at school, I will collect my child from school immediately; On my commute, and when dropping my child off and picking them up, I will adhere to the 2 metre social distancing rules; When dropping off and picking up, I will strictly stick to the school timings for my child; My child must not bring any items into school with them or take items home from school; My child will have their temperature taken on arrival and during the day if they feel or present as being unwell; I will need to remind my child about social distancing rules but accept they are difficult to follow and that my child may not always do this successfully; My child will need to use good respiratory and hand hygiene; I need to support all staff in their efforts to create an 'as safe as possible' environment during this crisis; Read all letters/messages/emails that are sent home; I need to inform the school immediately of any changes to parents/carer and emergency contacts details; If my child is unable to follow the school's expectations, then my child will be sent home and will not be able to come back into school until they can be safe. 	<p>I will do my best to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Adhere to the social distancing rules in class and in the playground; Tell an adult if I feel unwell; Not bring things into school from home, or take things home from school; Only use the equipment provided to me by school and no other; Not mix with any other children in the school; Only enter and exit the school building from the designated gate; Follow good respiratory hygiene: coughing and sneezing into elbow or tissue (catch it-bin it-kill it); Follow good hand hygiene - use soap and water for 20 seconds/ hand sanitizer; Behave well at all times to maintain the safety of myself and others; Follow these expectations and know that if I don't, I will be sent home and will not be able to come back into school until I can be safe.

Why can more children go to school?

- It is good for children's mental wellbeing.
- School is the best place for them to learn.
- It is good for children to socialise with other children.

What has changed?

From June 1st we will welcome back children, but only from Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and year 6. School will still be open for key workers' children and vulnerable children.

Children will continue to learn from home. Learning Projects are available on the school website, under Pupil-Learning at Home menu and will be shared on Class Dojo by teachers at the start of the week. The work children are set to complete at home will be the same work for children in school.

What about their brothers and sisters?

- Only children in the year groups above.
- Children in years 2 - 5 need to stay at home.

What if there is a case of Coronavirus in school?

The person with symptoms must self isolate for 7 days.

The people the one with must self isolate for 14 days.

If anyone at school tests positive, the whole class must self isolate for 14 days.

What else might change?

- The time you drop off and pick up your child.
- Your child may have a different classroom & teacher.
- They may not have all their normal lessons.
- We will change how we serve lunch.

How are you making sure school is safe?

- We will check fit-tests before school is open.
- Everyone will wash their hands regularly.
- If a child or family member is sick they can not come to school.
- School will be cleaned regularly.
- There will be less children in a room together.
- To do this we will need to make changes to the school day.

Does my child have to come to school?

- If your child is well and in one of the groups asked to attend they should.
- There will be no fines if your child does not go to school.

Will my child be tested?

- Yes, if your child shows symptoms of Coronavirus they will be tested.

This test will not be carried out through school, however the government has said that testing will be made available for key workers and children if they have symptoms.
