Covid-19 Symptoms, Symptomatic and Positive Result

What are Covid-19 symptoms?

The main symptoms of COVID-19 are:

- A new continuous cough and/or
- Fever (temperature of 37.8 degrees or higher)
- Loss of or change in, normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia)

Children may also display gastrointestinal symptoms

What is the mode of transmission?

COVID-19 is passed from person to person mainly by large respiratory droplets and direct contact (close unprotected contact, usually less than a metre). These droplets can be directly inhaled by a person, or can land on surfaces which another person may touch which can lead to infection if they touch their nose, mouth or eyes.

What is the incubation period?

The incubation period (ie. time between exposure to the virus and developing symptoms) is between 1 and 14 days.

When is a person infectious?

A person is thought to be infectious 48 hours before symptoms appear, and up to seven days after they start displaying symptoms.

Should a child come to school if a member of their household is unwell?

No. If a member of the child's household is unwell with COVID-19 symptoms then the child should isolate for 14 days starting from the day the household member(s) became ill. If the child subsequently develops symptoms then they should isolate for 10 days from the date they developed symptoms. The household members should be tested within 5 days of symptom onset. If all symptomatic household members test negative, the child member can return to school.

If a bubble has been excluded, should their siblings self-isolate for 14 days with the bubble?

No. Siblings of a bubble are contacts of a contact therefore, they do not need to self-isolate unless their sibling develops symptoms.

If a child has COVID-19 symptoms, gets tested and tests negative, can they return to school even if they still have symptoms?

If the child is NOT a known contact of a confirmed case the child can return to school if the result is negative, provided they feel well and they have not had a fever for 48 hours.

If the child is a contact of a confirmed case, they must stay off school for the 14 day isolation period, even if they test negative. This is because they can develop the infection at any point within the 14 days (in incubation period for COVID-19), so if a child tests negative on day 3 they may still go on to develop the infection.

If a child who was a contact of a confirmed case tests negative, can they return to school?

No, the child should complete 14 days of isolation.

If a child has a temperature which disappeared and Ill informed the parent that they do not have COVID-19 symptoms, can the child return to school?

No, if the child had a temperature they must not return to the setting until they complete the 10 days self-isolation. After the 10 days self-isolation has completed then they can only return to the setting if they have not had a fever for 48 hours.

Changes to Government guidelines concerning bubbles/households

- Allow the social bubble to expand to a household and a single two-person household for the purposes of childcare: this would allow grandparents who are often active carers to continue childcare responsibility in a defined and limited way
- Allow registered childminders or a single designated family member to provide childcare into the family home.
