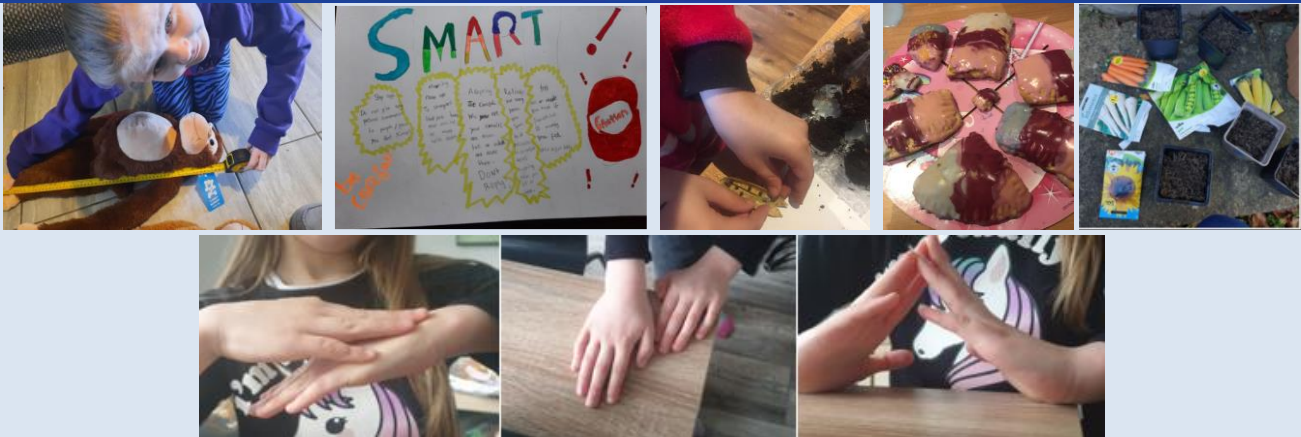

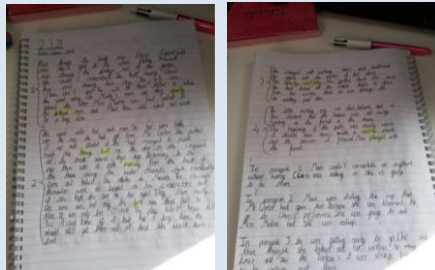

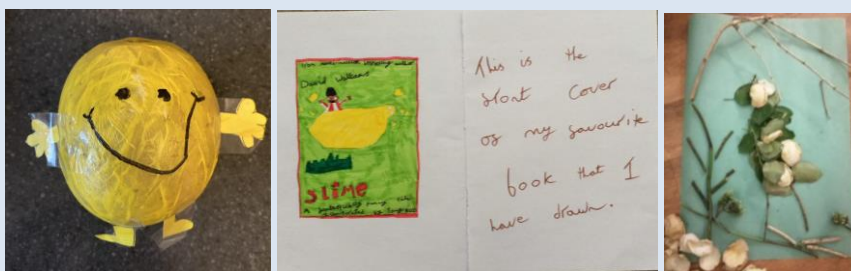
This week, Year 3 children have been working hard at home planting, baking doing maths work and creating posters for 'Online Safety'.
