IMPORTANT REMINDER - ARRIVAL TIMES

Laptop returns:

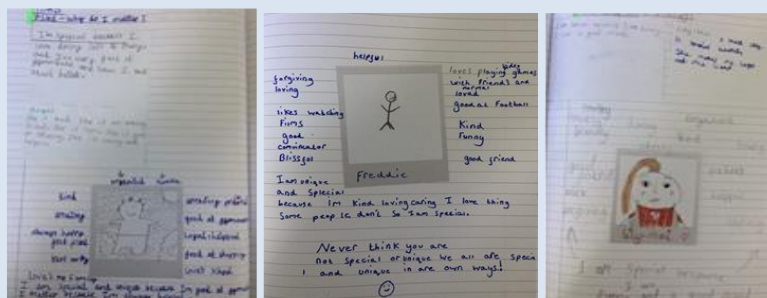
We will be contacting parents/carers whose laptops have not yet been returned to organise further return dates.

Year 3



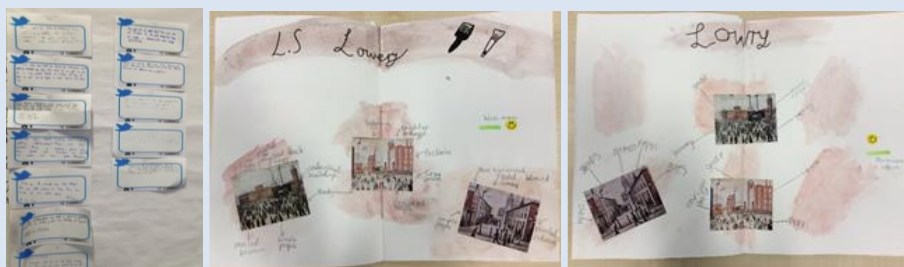
