



Every student. Every day.

Research shows that there is a direct link between school attendance and attainment and progress. Children with poor attendance tend to achieve less in both primary and secondary school. At Reaside we aim to support and enable our pupils to fulfil their potential and provide them with every opportunity for a positive and successful future. In order to achieve this, you have a responsibility for ensuring the attendance and punctuality of your child.

Punctuality is equally important, as a child who is late is also missing out on learning opportunities and lost learning. The Reaside school day begins at **8:50am** every morning, and lessons begin. A pupil arriving late for a lesson not only misses learning but also causes disruption for the other pupils in class.



What can parents / carers do?

- Ensure your child attends school every day and on time.
- If your child is not well enough to attend contact the school by 9.30am on the first day of absence.
- Have everything ready the night before to avoid delays in the morning.
- Have good bedtime and morning routines with set times for going to bed and waking up.
- Try to make dental and medical appointments outside of school time or at weekends.
- Take family holidays during the school holiday. We are unable to authorise term time holidays.
- Contact us immediately if you need help or support with your child's attendance or punctuality.

You must have the school's permission to take your child out of school, only in exceptional circumstances.

Taking your child on holiday, or having the day off for their birthday, are not exceptional circumstances.
